Instead the answer is to draw near to Jesus in devotion and with authentic expressions of that devotion, which themselves help paint the image of Christ found concretely in revelation onto the minds and into the daily life of the devout. Rather, it is a return to the roots of the novena tradition, which simply consists in nine days of devout prayer for a certain (often urgent) intention. The prayers inside this book are intended as tools to enable you to pray your own novenas - for whatever intentions you may have, and with whatever time your schedule allows. As such, all the prayers inside - beyond the explicit novena prayers - are suitable for use in novenas or as novenas in themselves. Prayers for Novenas is a book that will help you to pray more novenas. It will help develop skill in the language of prayer and inform the underlying theology of prayer. the local bishop, Pope Innocent III, Cardinal Ugolino, Saint Anthony of Padua and Saint Clare. What emerges is a new understanding of the saint. This collection of folk tales, legends, and narratives about the life of Francis of Assisi and his followers appeared about seventy-five years after the saint's death, in the early fourteenth century.
